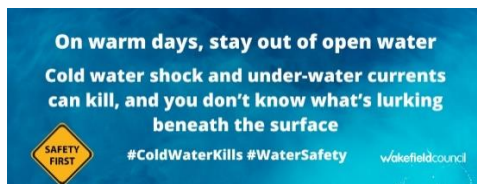
### Water Safety

We urge you to discuss the dangers of open water with your child. We're asking everyone to be aware of the risks of cooling off or playing in ponds, lakes, and flooded quarries. Swimming in open water is extremely dangerous as hidden dangers can lurk beneath the surface. This can include discarded waste which can trap people, as well as slippery rocks and sudden changes in water depth. Jumping into cold water can also cause people to go into shock. Previous warm and sunny weather has seen people risking their lives, and sadly losing their lives, by swimming in open water – despite signs warning them not too.

### Equipment

A reminder that students will need the following equipment, in a pencil case, on their first day back in September:

- Black pen
- Purple pen
- Pencil
- Rubber
- Highlighter
- Ruler

Students are expected to bring this equipment every day and it will be checked on the gate and by Form Tutors during Form Time. All new Year 7 students will be provided with this equipment, and with a school bag, If students wish to purchase their own stationery, that is fine, however, it is essential that they have all the items on this list.

**Students are also expected to bring a school bag to school every day.** If they don't have a bag on the first day back, we will give them one to use.

### Uniform Reminders

Please refer to the uniform guide on our website to ensure your child is prepared and ready for the new school year. If you would like to bring any new uniform in to school to check that it is in line

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with our policy, a member of staff will be available to do this on **Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> August from 10am-12pm**. This will take place in reception.

Please see a few reminders below of the most frequent issues with our uniform guidelines:

- Make up should be minimal and false eyelashes are not allowed
- Hair colour should be natural with no extreme styles, no shaved areas or patterns and not lower than a grade 1
- Eyebrows should not be shaved or patterned
- No nail varnish or acrylic nails
- Only one stud earring allowed in each ear – in the lobe
- No smart watches
- No facial piercings – no clear retainers
- **Skirts must be the Airedale Academy issued skirt – no other skirts are permitted**
- Hoodies made of a jersey material, with or without a zip and are not permitted. Hoodies will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day
- Graffiti and writing on hands and arms is not permitted

In line with our policy, students who breach our uniform expectations will be asked to address the issue raised. Jewellery, mobile devices and hoodies will be confiscated and stored in student reception, whereby they can be collected at the end of the day. A detention will also be issued for all breaches, parents / carers will be notified on the second incident, subsequent confiscations will receive a detention. Detentions will also be issued for other breaches of the uniform policy.

Please note that we do not suspend students for wearing jewellery, having mobile phones or any other breaches of this policy. We will however, always ask students to rectify the issue that we have raised. These are reasonable requests.

If a student fails to comply immediately with a reasonable request, this is considered defiance, the Academy will issue a further sanction, which may include a suspension. Parents and carers should be clear that this applies to all reasonable requests and not just those associated with uniform. We appreciate your support in upholding our high standards.

### **Attendance and Term Time Holidays**

The Academy will continue to have attendance as a priority next academic year. We do all we can to encourage students to attend school every day and value your support from home with this. Holidays should not be taken during term time. This will directly impact negatively on the progress of your child.

As we go into the summer holidays, we will have information we need to share with you ready for our return. It is therefore really important we have up to date contact details for you. If you have the My Child at School app you can view the information we hold for you and send us updates as changes happen.
