Dear Parent / Guardian,

The Duke of Edinburgh's Silver Award 2022-2023

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is available to any of our students in Y9 and Y10 (not just fans of the great outdoors). The DofE encourages teamwork and social interaction and helps young people to stand out from the crowd when applying for university and jobs. It is the world's leading extra-curricular award.

Cost

The cost for The DofE Award account is £25.

This covers the cost of the student's registration fees, the Welcome Pack and online DofE account (eDofE). This money cannot be reimbursed once paid as the Welcome Pack stays with the student until the age of 25.

How it works

Students in Y10 can take part in the Silver Award.

Students need to commit their time to work towards the three sections listed below and then take part in a small expedition later in the year. I have listed ideas for different activities that count towards each section at the end of this letter.

[†]Note: All students completed Bronze Award last year. If you **didn't** do Bronze (i.e. you are new to the school this year and did not do Bronze at your previous school), you must do a further 6 months (24 hours) of either volunteering or the longer of the physical/skill section.

Temporary Changes to The DofE Award

In light of Covid-19, temporary changes to The DofE rules allow for a greater flexibility in terms of what can count towards the different sections – students can complete any sort of volunteering at home e.g. helping around the house, helping younger/older siblings, ringing older relatives to check in on them.

Silver Award - Expedition

Students will take part in a small expedition as part of one of their activities. There will be an additional cost for the expedition for the campsite fees – we estimate the total cost of the expedition to be in the region of £30. Students will be provided with a tent, rucksack, sleeping bag, compass, gas stove & cylinder and survival bag. Students will need a pair of walking boots and waterproofs as well as food for the expedition.

We will be running sessions afterschool as well to help students prepare for their expedition and help to ensure they have evidenced their other activities in the volunteering, physical and skills section.

Silver Award - Expedition Dates

28 February 2023 Expedition Training Day (at school)

7 March 2023 Training Walk afterschool (Circular loop of Fairburn Ings)

4-6 May 2023 Practice Expedition (2-day, 2-night expedition at High Lea Farm in Silkstone)

6-8 July 2023 Qualifying Expedition (3-day, 2-night expedition at Bolton Abbey)

How do I register my child for The DofE Award?

Pay the £25 registration fee on the My Child at School (MCAS) app:

By enrolling your child, you consent for us to provide the DofE with your child's details necessary for enrolment and allow us to pay the necessary registration fee for the welcome pack. This money cannot be reimbursed once paid as the Welcome Pack stays with the student until the age of 25.

What happens once my child signs up for The DofE Award?

Students will receive an *eDofE* account. This is where your child logs their progress through their DofE programme and where the school checks and approves they have completed the activity in each section. Students can start their DofE sections straight away (including the summer holidays).
