

SCIENCE ALL THE WAY THIS **AUTUMN!**

It has been a really busy start to the year. Here are some of the highlights so far:

- Students in Y10 have visited Concorde at Manchester Airport. They sat in the Queen's seat and had an extended period
- Students in Y11 are raising money for Cancer Research. This will involve taking on the Yorkshire Three Peaks Challenge later in the year. It's a gruelling walk, so to prepare for it, students have started with smaller training walks. The first walk was 8 miles around Bolton Abbey, which students thoroughly enjoyed.
- Two lucky students have met a real NASA Astronaut: Bruce McCandless. Bruce blasted into space twice: once aboard the Challenger Space Shuttle and once on Discovery. He was the first astronaut to do an untethered spacewalk (using a jet pack). On his Discovery mission, his team was responsible for launching the Hubble telescope.



A visit was arranged to the National Space Centre in Leicester. Students were able to see a real Soyuz rocket, real moon rock, a mock-up of the Columbus module from the International Space Station and Helen Sharman's space suit.

- Tim Peake's Soyuz Capsule has recently been on display at the Bradford Science and Media Museum. Students visited the museum on 11 November to view the capsule that brought Tim back down to Earth in June 2016. The Yorkshire Games Festival was also taking place the same day, so students took part in video games related activities as well as taking part in the experiments on show, such as the very disconcerting mirror maze!
- Students in Y8 will be representing the department in the Faraday Challenge at Hemsworth Academy. In the challenge, teams will be pitted against each other to design, create and promote the best solution to a given challenge. Students are only given the problem on the day of the challenge! Overall we enjoyed the trip and would recommend the Thackray Medical Museum."

SIXTH FORM

Over the last month, seven Year 13 Health and Social Care BTEC students undertook 100 hours of work experience with a number of different local health and social care providers working together as part of the Connecting Care programme. Connecting Care brings together partners from social care, healthcare, housing and voluntary sector organisations across the Wakefield district to improve integration of care.

Placements have been personally tailored for every student according to their individual career goals and ambitions. Airedale students were placed in a variety of roles across Wakefield, including: General practice nursing; Residential care with Wakefield Council; Dementia Support Services and childcare at the Mid Yorkshire Hospitals Trust; Mental health nursing at South West Yorkshire Partnership Foundation Trust; Fire and Rescue community services with West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue

Students also participated in a week's training and workshops with Connecting Care partners learning essential healthcare skills such as emergency first aid and dementia awareness. These sessions were be co-ordinated in partnership with Carers Wakefield and District, Spectrum Community Health, West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Wakefield Council and the Mid Yorkshire Hospitals Trust. This was a fantastic opportunity to develop real and valuable work experience for our students and we have been very fortunate to be the first school to be invited to be involved.








GO GO GO JOSEPH!
